The Inside Line

Welcome to Waterford Hills Road Racing. The August meet is traditionally a hot one in terms of both the competition and the weather. This season we have seen a lot of closely contested races. So, spread out the blanket and open a cold one. If you came to enjoy road racing you will not be disappointed.

Club members would like to extend a special welcome to staff and clients of the Uniroyal-Goodrich Tire Company, here to enjoy motor sport, Waterford style. We applaud your continued support and product development for a variety of forms of racing. We hope this new combination of OEM and aftermarket strength proves beneficial to all involved.

Speaking of tires, because of its high proportion of curved roadway, Waterford Hills is regarded as a handling course where brute power is a secondary concern. Many of the racing classes provide for little variation in suspension set up. The differences in lap times between similar cars are often due to the teams selection of tires.

There are many brands to chose from and most manufacturers produce different tread compounds which respond to heat in different ways. The trick is to pick a brand and compound that will heat up enough under racing conditions to develop good cornering force without overheating. Too much heat causes blistering or "chunking" of the tread rubber. Too little heat will keep the tires from developing maximum cornering force. Tires are a big part of each team's budget so the drivers try to make their choices wisely. There is no quicker way to gain as much as 5 seconds a lap.

INSIDER TIP: If this is your first time at Waterford, or if you always watch from the same spot, try moving around to check out different vantage points. You can see how the cars react to elevation changes through turns 1 and 2 as well as at Hilltop.

Passing under braking often occurs at Archers corner at the end of the back straight and in turn 3. The effects of understeer and oversteer can be clearly seen as the cars pass through Paddock curve.

Something to learn from each location, even if you don't want to permanently abandon your favorite spot.

Enjoy yourself and have a safe trip home. We hope you'll rejoin us for the last race weekend of the season — September 26-27.

Racing Classes

To insure fairness in competition, all road racing cars are grouped into racing classes by the Sports Car Club of America in its General Competition Rulebook (GCR). Waterford Hills Road Racing observes the GCR regulations with some minor exceptions.

The five Competition groups are: Production (sport cars), Showroom Stock (GT cars and sports cars with minimal modification), Sports Racing (Highly modified engine and body over wheels), GT (enclosed cockpit passenger cars and former big production cars), and Formula (open wheels single cockpit). Racing groups are subdivided into classes of equally competitive cars based upon engine size and handling characteristics.

The cars listed below are representative of their racing classes and include most of those you will see at Waterford Hills.

FORMULA

FF	Formula Ford — Cortina or Pinto 1600 cc engine, strict weight to engine ratio with driver's weight included in total legal weight, very equal class
FFR	Formula Ford Radial — the cars are the same as the above class except they must use BF goodrich T/A radial tires
FV	Formula Vee — all Volkswagen components, 1200 cc engine, driver's weight included in total legal weight, very competitive class
F/ATLC	Formula Atlantic — choice of engines in over 1100 cc up to 16000 cc range, wings and other modifications allowed, not meant to be an inexpensive race car
F/CNTL	Formula Continental — engine up to 1100 cc, rear wings allowed, combines the modifications of the previous Formula C and Formula Super Vee classes
F440	Formula 440 — utilizes Fuji two-cycle snowmobile engines and drive train, rigid suspension, wings permitted
F4	Formula Four — Canadian class, motorcycle engine power plant, engine size determines weight and transmission allowed

Flags

yellow with red stripes



Take care, oil has been spilled or a slippery condition exists somewhere in your vicinity. Look at the track surface.

black



Sloppy or dangerous driving. Complete the lap you are on, stop at the Start/Finish line for consultation with Chief Steward. Waving Black Flag (displayed on all corner stations) means the race is stopped. Slow down immediately and proceed around the track with extreme caution to the pit lane for a re-start.

black with orange ball



(Meatball Black Flag) There is something mechanically wrong with your car. Proceed to your pits at reduced speed.

green



(Or no flag) Course is clear.

yellow



(Stationary) Take care, danger, no passing. (Waving) Great danger, be prepared to stop, no passing.

red



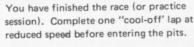
Waving red (displayed by the Starter only) means the race is stopped, slow down immediately and proceed around the track with extreme caution to the pit lane.

blue with diagonal yellow stripes



(Motionless) Another competitor is following you closely.

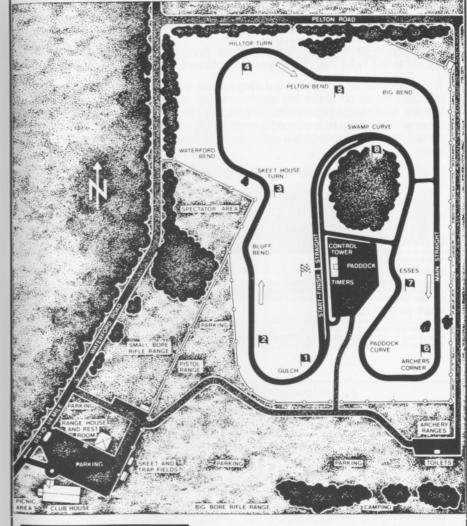

Chances are you live within a few minutes of the Midwest's premier road course. The W.H.R.R.I. Race Track is located just 6 miles north of Pontiac on Waterford Road, 1/4 mile each of Dixie Highway (U.S. 10) in Waterford, Michigan. The easiest route to take is I-75 to the southbound Sashabaw Exit. Take Sashabaw south to Pelton Road, then take Pelton west to Waterford Road. The total distance after exiting the expressway is 2-1/2 miles.

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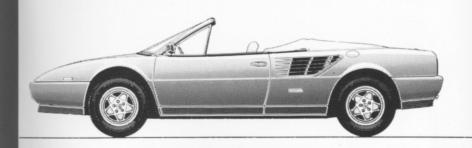
