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

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

Most of our regular WHRRI drivers are back this year, so you can count on cheering for your favorites — look for some to be in brand new cars. Several of our drivers are racing as a team so look for the writing on the cars — that indicates the driver's team or racing sponsor. The big numbers on the sides and decks are the driver's number of record for the race — you can find his name and hometown on the entry list with that number. The small letters (EP, FV, GT-2, SSB) name the class the car is running in so you can tell who is really dicing with whom!

We are welcoming a lot of new drivers from our April competition school this month. They are the guys and gals sporting those dayglo orange triangles on the rear deck. That triangle says "nervous novice" so take care when passing. That's part of the game since every winner had to be a rookie once!

Besides our super drivers and their crews, we have some very excellent volunteer race workers. It takes about 150 "behind the scenes" people to make our race programs run so smoothly. If you'd like to join them, come to our club meeting the first Wednesday of the month in the O.C.S.C. clubhouse (the big, log building at the entrance) at 8:00 p.m.

We are delighted to continue two popular special features this season: the "Looking Back with Bizer" photo features of Al Bizer and the humorous "Four Wheel Drift" columns of Publicity Director, Karl Nilsson.

A Vintage Car Race the weekend of May 24 & 25 is the first of many special events planned for the 1980 season. Challenge runs and personal appearances by your favorite radio and media personalities highlight our summer weekends. Parade laps by local marque clubs, including the Midwest Trans-Am Club and the English Car Clubs of Michigan, are already scheduled.

We especially want to welcome back our fans from last season and to say a hearty "Hello" to those of you who are joining us for the first time.

We will be racing the last full weekend from now through September (check the schedule on the back of your program) so plan right now to come back and enjoy our sport with us. In the meantime, just sit back and savor the opening of the 1980 racing year!

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

I'd like to welcome all of our new friends who may have met us for the first time at this year's Autorama at Cobo Hall. Way back in January, Waterford Hills Road Racing Club entered a large display featuring nine racecars that represented a cross-section of our average race weekend. A hoarse crew of club members spent three days and nights explaining what we're all about to a good percentage of the 110,000 viewers that filed past our club display.

Apparently, seeing a road-racer was a real shock to some of the spectators at the nation's largest hot rod show. The drag racers thought we were weird because we put slicks on all four wheels. The street rodders thought we were weird for building cars that couldn't cruise Woodward. The custom car freaks were a little kinder. They just assumed we ran out of money before we could have everything chromeplated. They're so well trained, that the only way you can spot our novice drivers is by the orange triangle on the backe of their cars. As always, we encourage our rookies and wish them the best of luck.

Be sure to join us June 29th, as we celebrate another "W4 Day at the Races." The WWWW-FM disc jockeys will trade headphones for helmets in a lunchtime celebrity race. Enjoy the fun on Sunday, then tune to 106 on Monday — but don't be surprised if they sound a little different...after all, a spin-out in turn three is guaranteed to make even the deepest voice go up a few octaves.

racing classes

To insure fairness in competition, all road racing cars are grouped into racing classes by the Sports Car Club of America in its General Competition Rulebook, (GCR), Waterford Hills Road Racing observes the GCR regulations with some minor exceptions.

The five competition classes are: Production (sports cars), Showroom Stock (GT cars and sports cars with minimal modification), Sports Racing (highly modified engine and body over wheels), GT Class (enclosed cockpit passenger cars, formerly sedan class), and Formula (open wheels and single cockpit).

The cars listed below are representative of their racing classes and include most of those you will see at Waterford Hills.

 - Pinto 1600, Fiat 124/Sports Coupe, Datsun 510 1600, Dodge Colt, Toyota Corolla 1600.
- GT-4 Austin/Morris Mini Cooper, VW 1300, NSU TT, Renault LeCar, Fiat 124 1200, Toyota Coralla 1200.

FORMULA

- Formula Ford Cortina or Pinto 1600 cc engine, strict weight to engine ratio, very equal cars
- Formula Vee all Volkswagen components, 1200 cc engine, only formula class where total legal weight includes driver's weight, very competitive
- F/ALTC Formula Atlantic choice of engines in the over 1100 cc up to 1600 cc range, wings and other modifications allowed, not meant to be an inexpensive race car.
- F/CNTL Formula Continental engines up to 1100 cc, rear wings allowed, combines the modifications of the previous Formula C and Formual Super Vee classes
- F 440 Formula 440 utilizes Fuji two-cycle snowmobile engines and drive train, rigid suspension, wings permitted
- Formula Four Canadian class, motorcycle engine power plant, engine size determines weight and transmission allowed

flags

vellow with red stripes



Take care, oil has been spilled or a slippery condition exists somewhere in your vicinity. Look at the track

black



Sloppy or dangerous driving. Complete the lap you are on, then stop at the Start/Finish line for consultation with the Chief Steward.

black with orange ball



(Meatball black flag) There is something mechanically wrong with your car. Proceed to your pits at reduced speed.

green



(Or no flag) Course is clear.

vellow



(Stationary) Take care, danger, no passing. (Waving) Great danger, be prepared to stop, no passing.

red



Stop immediately, clear the course as well as circumstances permit; the race has been stopped.

blue with diagonal yellow stripes



(Motionless) Another competitor is following you closely.


checkered

You have finished the race (or practice session). Complete one "cool-off" lap at reduced speed before entering the pits.

a 1.5 mile asphalt road course at waterford, michigan







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
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
