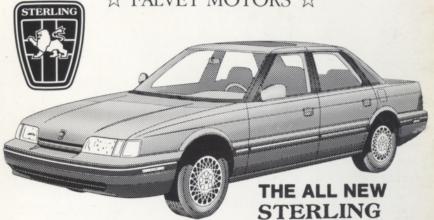


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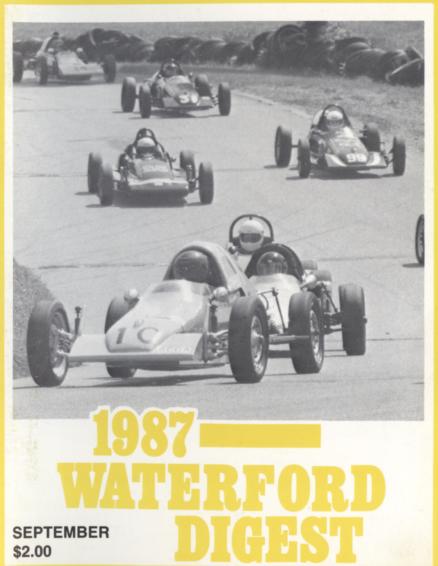

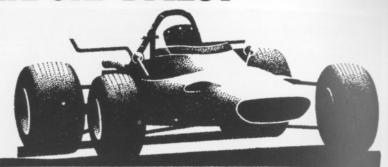

Notice that entrants from virtually all of WHRRI's five racing groups are in contention for the Top Ten. Reliability and consistent placing at the head of the class, not the type of car being raced, are the keys to Top Ten status.

A first-in-class finish is worth 9 points. Second through fifth bring between 1 and 6 points depending on the number of cars entered in the class. A class record lap time nets 1 point.

With this in mind, take another look at the point totals on the list. It's easy to see that a couple of DNF's and some surprise first place finishes could change the final order significantly. So whaddya think? Are you going to see ROAD RACING today? You bet! Kick back and enjoy our Fall Finale. We hope to see you again next year.

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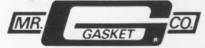

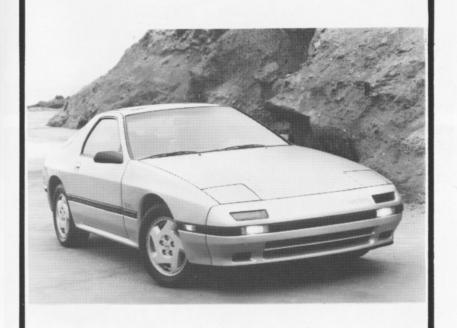




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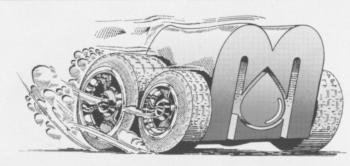

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FEATURE STORY

It's the next-to-the-last race of the last day of the 1987 Racing season here at Waterford Hills. You're probably starting to pack up the car, find the baby and munch up the crumbs in the bottom of the potato chip bag. Wait a moment — sit back down. There's something a little different about this race. If you can find your binoculars, look at the starter up there hanging over the finish line. He's wearing a black and white polka-dot shirt. Not the regular fellow, is he? You've got sharp eyes. For this last closed-wheel race, and this race only every year, our regular starter is replaced by a young man named Kent Lawrence. Mr Lawrence travels all the way from Santa Monica, California, nowadays, just to do this. Why? It's an interesting story...

In March of 1958, Ed Lawrence, one of the principal designers and builders of this road course, was in a fatal accident at Sebring, Florida while racing a Maserati. He left his wife, three small sons and hundreds of friends to continue his dream of a road racing track here in Waterford. On October 10th and 11th, 1959, seven months after his death, this dream came true and the first races were held on the track he helped build. His many friends had chipped in and donated a perpetual trophy — The Lawrence Memorial — to be awarded to the winner of the large-bore feature race at the end of every season. On that long ago October Sunday, Ed's widow, Joan, was the starter for that very special race.

Joan continued the tradition every year until 1964 when she handed the honor over to her son Kent. At six years of age, proud little Kent was about the same size as the flag he used to start the race. It must have been terribly heavy in his hands. But he did the job, and at the end of the race, he awarded his father's trophy to the winner. Every year since then, Kent has started this race...his personal tribute to his father's dream.

The Lawrence Memorial Trophy will awarded this year, not necessarily to the winner of this feature race today, but to the driver who has accumulated the best record in a Sports Racing car all season. And Kent won't hand the trophy to the winner at the end of the race, because it, and many other special trophies, will be awarded later on this year when all the points have been counted and all the dust has finally settled. Long before then, our special starter will be back home in California.

Watch Kent Lawrence do his job during the last, closed-wheel, feature race this Sunday afternoon. He is a living link with Waterford Roadracing's past. And he's been doing it a long, long time....

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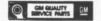
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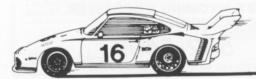

Racing Classes

To insure fairness in competition, all road racing cars are grouped into racing classes by the Sports Car Club of America in its General Competition Rulebook (GCR). Waterford Hills Road Racing observes the GCR regulations with some minor exceptions.

The five Competition groups are: Production (sport cars), Showroom Stock (GT cars and sports cars with minimal modification), Sports Racing (Highly modified engine and body over wheels), GT (enclosed cockpit passenger cars and former big production cars), and Formula (open wheels single cockpit). Racing groups are subdivided into classes of equally competitive cars based upon engine size and handling characteristics.

black



Sloppy or dangerous driving. Complete the lap you are on, stop at the Start/Finish line for consultation with Chief Steward. Waving Black Flag (displayed on all corner stations) means the race is stopped. Slow down immediately and proceed around the track with extreme caution to the pit lane for a re-start.

black with orange ball



(Meatball Black Flag) There is something mechanically wrong with your car. Proceed to your pits at reduced speed.

green



(Or no flag) Course is clear.

yellow



(Stationary) Take care, danger, no passing. (Waving) Great danger, be prepared to stop, no passing.

red



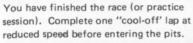
Waving red (displayed by the Starter only) means the race is stopped, slow down immediately and proceed around the track with extreme caution to the pit lane.

blue with diagonal yellow stripes



(Motionless) Another competitor is following you closely.

The easiest route to take is I-75 to the southbound Sashabaw Exit. Take Sashabaw south to Pelton Road, then take Pelton west to Waterford Road. The total distance after exiting the expressway is 2-1/2 miles.

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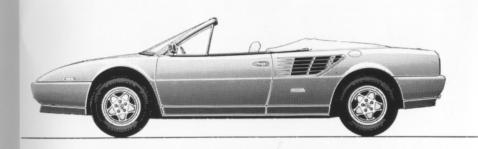
